

SAVVA Technical Tip 81 - Earth straps

So often engines are removed and the earth straps are discarded and not refitted. The starter motor draws a considerable amount of current via the heavy lead that connects to the positive terminal of the battery to the starter via the starter relay. One must keep in mind that a similar conductor/path must take the negative current back to the batteries negative terminal from the starter motors body.

The problem with the return path is that the engine is invariably electrically isolated from the chassis by the rubber engine and gearbox mountings. To overcome this problem a heavy braided strap is connected somewhere between the engine or gearbox and the chassis. The braided strap pictured is typical of those that fit across one of the engine mountings allowing a heavy current to travel between the engine and chassis.

So often these straps are discarded when an engine is removed and replaced and the consequences can be extremely dangerous. If the earthing strap has been discarded or broken and the starter motor operated, the current will take whatever route is available back to the battery. If a proper path has not been provided it will find it's own way back. This could be via a choke cable, accelerator cables or even worse, a metal fuel line. In extreme cases the current will have to travel from the engine to the gearbox along the drive shaft via the universal joints to the back axle, then, up through the spring shackles, shock absorbers or hand brake cable to the chassis where the battery is earthed.

If the starter motor is sluggish – before buying a new battery or replacing the starter itself, check the negative route back to the battery. It's possible the earth strap is missing, broken or even loose. If in doubt, try hooking a heavy temporary lead from the body of the starter to the negative terminal of the battery and see if things improve.

TECHNICAL TIP - NO: 79

Electric fans

The hot weather is with us again, or just around the comer. Hurrah, but think of your cherished oldie – they don't appreciate the warm weather like we do.

Our older cars were never made to sit in the heavy traffic we experience today and the old fan turning at idling speed isn't going to help very much. One needs a good gust of wind through the radiator to keep it cool - which can only be accomplished by the fitting of an electric fan.

I've just had a radiator cleaned out and whilst it was out I thought it may be worthwhile investigating the possibility of converting to an electric fan and the cost thereof. A trip to the local Silverton radiator shop soon answered my curiosity. The proprietor knew exactly what I required and placed in front of me a fan switch (thermostat) and a brass receptacle that needed to be soldered into the bottom of the radiator. They apparently do this on a regular basis.

Installation of the electric fan is very simple and no special expertise is required. You must however check how much space you have available at either side of the radiator then decide which type of electric fan would best fit - a "push" or "pull" fan. Pull fans are used in most front wheel drive cars and are obtainable from various spares outlets. Push fans can be a bit difficult to find - the best source are the car aircon dealers and they carry them in stock. They usually come in 10" 12 "14" sizes. The cost of a 10" is around R310.00. A warning however - the contacts in the thermostat switches are extremely light and cannot take much current so it is imperative that a relay be used – at least 35 amps or even heavier if you can find one.

Attached is a picture of a typical thermostat switch and the brass receptacle (socket) which fits into the bottom of the radiator. The black unit is an alternative receptacle which can be fitted into the bottom hose (rather than taking the radiator out) and takes the standard thermostat switch. If you can't find these sockets in your part of the world they are available from Silverton's in Greymont, Johannesburg and sell for R150.00 each. They can be ordered by contacting them on 011 022 7056 or 078 633 4770.

Total cost of an installation, including the switch, socket, relay and the fan, should be between R500.00 and R600.00.

STEVE MCQUEEN'S 1938 HARLEY-DAVIDSON SOLD ON 23 NOVEMBER

No one will ever be as cool as Steve McQueen, but owning his Harley-Davidson might be the next best thing. McQueen's 1938 Harley WLD Solo Sport was sold at a Mecum Auctions event in Anaheim, California for \$125 000. The bike still wore its original factory paint, and its odometer shows 21,000 miles. The Harley's pedigree is fully documented, including a certificate of authenticity from McQueen's 1984 estate sale. It also comes with a few of McQueen's own tools, which were found in a frame-mounted tool box when the bike was first sold. The last major McQueen motoring artifact to cross the auction block was a 1951 Chevrolet Styleline DeLuxe Convertible McQueen drove in his last film, The Hunter, and purchased after shooting wrapped. Subsequently bought by Rick Harrison, of the History Channel show "Pawn Stars," the Chevy sold for \$88,000 at an Auctions America event last January. Seemingly everything associated with the King of Cool attracts money, and this Harley wasn't any different.

HUMPHREY BOGART'S 1940 CASABLANCA BUICK SOLD

The 1940 Buick phaeton driven by Humphrey Bogart in Casablanca came up for auction on 25 November. The car was part of Bonhams "What Dreams Are Made Of: A Century Movie Magic" auction in New York City. Buick in question is a Model \$1C trunkback convertible phaeton, reportedly one of just 230 made for the 1940 model year. It currently shows 42,000 miles on the odometer, and was the recipient of a mechanical restoration in the 1990s. This is a car from a time when no one had heard the words "crossover" or "four-door coupe," but buyers still had plenty

of choices when it came to body styles. Other than a bit of movie magic, got a 320-cubic inch inline-eight engine, three-speed manual transmission, and Aztec Brown paint. The car was owned by Warner Brothers until 1970, when it was sold to the first of a series of private owners. It last sold in June 1995 for \$211,500 and this time it went for \$461,000.

VIRTUAL TOUR OF THE LAMBORGHINI MUSEUM IN BOLOGNESE

It's now possible to take a stroll through Lamborghini's official museum in Sant'Agata Bolognese from the comfort of your own home, thanks to the magic of Google Maps. Using the same technology as the Google Maps street view function, you can simply click your way through the two floors of the Lamborghini



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museum and even peer inside many of the cars. That's right, the virtual experience includes a feature that allows users to access an interior view of a select few models. Highlights include the Reventon, Sesto Elemento and Estoque concept car.

Spread across 1,500 square meters of show space, the museum's collection also includes a selection of Lamborghini legends such as the Miura, Countach, Diablo and Murcielago as well as many prototypes, limited editions, one-off models, racing cars and marine engines. Unique scale models of original styling taken from Lamborghini's Centro Stile can also be found on display along with some of the legendary V-12 powertrains.





ROLLS-ROYCE EXHIBITED AT THE BMW MUSEUM IN MUNICH

While Rolls-Royce can trace its roots back more than a century, Rolls-Royce's automotive unit in its current form has only been building cars for the past decade. Yes, it was only ten years ago that the first of the latest-generation Rolls-Royce Phantom sedans was delivered to its owner, marking the reign of the prestigious British brand's ownership under German automaker BMW. Now, to mark ten years of success running Rolls-Royce, BMW has opened a new exhibition at its official museum, located next to its headquarters in Munich, Germany. The unique exhibition, entitled 'Strive for Perfection,' also commemorates yet another key

milestone in the history of the Rolls-Royce brand—the 150th anniversary of the birth of one of its founders, Sir Henry Royce (he was born on March 27, 1863, and died on April 22, 1933). The displays tell the story of Rolls-Royce in chronological detail; from the meeting of the company's founding fathers, Sir Henry Royce and Charles Stewart Rolls in 1904, through to the present day.



22 - 23	17 th O.D. INGGS Memorial Run	Albany Vintage and Classic Motor Club (AVCMC) Port Alfred	The OD Inggs Memorial Run is held annually in honour of classic automobile enthusiast Oliver Douglas Inggs who passed away at the age of 88 in 1997. Inggs ran a funeral business in Grahamstown and was one of the greatest collectors and restorers of old automobiles in Southern Africa. The run is entered by members of the Albany Vintage and Classic Motor Club (hosts), the Queenstown Automobile Club, the Border Vintage Car Club and the Eastern Province Veteran Car Club. Although an officially registered motorsport event, this regularity run rewards driving accuracy rather than speed. Competitors receive route schedules
		MOTOR CLUB	half an hour prior to their departure times, at one minute intervals. The schedules indicate numerous required speed changes and times at which certain landmarks must be arrived at along the way, often only seconds apart. Speedometers are covered up with tape, and the average speed required never exceeds 90 km/h.

Marshals are dotted along the route, dishing out penalty points for each second that a competitor is early or late. Penalty points accrue for each second the competitors are early or late so the crew with the least penalty points wins the event. Vehicles entered come from locations like Port Alfred, Grahamstown, Queenstown, East London, Port Elizabeth, George and further afield. The event is restricted to 40 entries. The run is officially approved by the Southern African Veteran and Vintage Association (SAVVA) and is for cars and motorcycles manufactured on or before 31 December 1980.
